4. BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

4.1 Tourism, Events and Promotions Committee Budget (Standing Item)

The total remaining budget for Tourism, Events and Promotions Committee as at 17 June 2021 is \$5,000.

Acting Manager Community and Cultural Development noted that the \$5,000 allocated to the NAIDOC night market has gone back to the TEP budget, due to the event's cancellation.

4.2 Bannerconda Update

At the last meeting, Council Officers provided new options for the location and cost for the bannerconda banner system and the Barrett Drive poles.

The Committee deferred discussion from the last meeting in order to seek further consideration of the matter when the rest of the Committee members are present.

Councillor Paterson advised that at the last Ordinary Council meeting, Council quarantined \$12,263.20 for the financial year 2021/22 for the bannerconda banner system (Council Resolution No.21709).

Discussion ensued about the allocation of TEP Committee budget for this financial year.

5. **DEPUTATIONS**

5.1 Barbara Quick, Census Inclusive Strategies, Australian Bureau of Statistics

Barbara Quick gave the following overview about the 2021 Census on 10 August:

- A specialist team is working on to capture tourists in the NT for the census.
- Specialist hubs and pick up points are being set-up to be able to issue forms, e.g. Libraries and accredited Tourist Bureaus.
- Information about the 2021 Census are available on the ABS Census website from July 2021.
- Census teams will be in remote communities from 26 July to 31 August.
- Information packs will be sent to this Committee

The Chair thanked Barbara Quick for her presentation.

6. OTHER BUSINESS

Jeanette Shepherd enquired if there is a proposed budget for the next financial year for this Committee to make its decision from, given that the Municipal Plan is still in draft form.

The Mayor advised that the Municipal Plan is still out in draft for public consultation. The Committee at this stage can work on similar budget lines from last financial year pending approval of the Municipal Plan.

6.1 Sponsorship Application – desertSMART Eco Fair

Councillor Cocking having declared an interest in Item 6.1, left the Arunta room at 4:16pm prior to discussion of this matter. Mayor Ryan took over the position of Chair.

The sponsorship request is for \$5,000 to support the delivery of the 13th annual Eco Fair as part of the National Science Week to be held from 6 to 8 August 2021.

The event received \$5,000 sponsorship from Council last year. An in-kind request was also received for a total of \$2,700.

Discussion ensued about the application in terms of the number of people who will attend, the total value of the event, in-kind support from Council and the benefits it will contribute to the Alice Springs community.

That Council support the application from Arid Lands Environment Centre to the value of \$1,500 towards the desertSMART Eco Fair to be held from 6 to 8 August 2021.

6.2 Sponsorship Application – Volunteer of the Year Awards

Volunteering SA & NT Inc is asking for \$4,000 + GST for the NT Volunteer of the Year Awards 2021 to be held on 9 November 2021. Council sponsored the same amount in 2020.

The Committee considered the application and agreed to support it at a lesser amount.

The Acting Manager Community and Cultural Development advised that the unconfirmed TEP budget in the draft Municipal Plan for financial year 2021/22 is \$50,000.

6.3 Sponsorship Application – BMX Territory Championships

AusCycling is requesting \$5,000 sponsorship from Council to assist the 2021 HutSix BMX Territory Championships on the 1st and 2nd of October 2021.

The Committee assessed the application and noted that this is the second time AusCycling put in an application this financial year.

That Council support the application from AusCycling to the value of \$3,000 towards the 2021 HutSix BMX Territory Championships to be held on 1 and 2 October 2021.

6.4 Sponsorship Application – Desert Song Festival

Central Australian Singing Incorporated is requesting \$10,000 financial sponsorship from Council in support of the Desert Song Festival to be held from 10 to 19 September 2021.

The Committee discussed the application and agreed that more information, such as sources of other funding and sponsorship received from Council in previous years, should be sought from the applicant to be able to provide a fair recommendation.

ACTION:

Council officers to seek further information from Central Australian Singing Inc on:

- where other sources of funding for this application are coming from and whether they have been confirmed
- recognition of previous support from Council from previous events

6.5 Sponsorship Application – Gordon Koang Live at Olive Pink

Watch this Space submitted a sponsorship application for \$3,000 to support the Gordon Koang and band concert as part of his national unity tour at Olive Pink on 20 August 2021. The funding will help keep ticket prices accessible and would go towards paying for lighting hire, production support, security, front of house staff and artist fees. People under 16 are free.

Mayor Ryan has some concerns with the application, that the tour is being announced tomorrow and the organisers only budgeted for half of the ticket sales.

Discussion ensued about the multicultural aspect of the application and how Multicultural Community Services of Central Australia may be able to help support the event through other funding sources. The Committee agreed to support it for \$1,500 ensuring that recognition to Council is well covered, given that the event is being publicly announced tomorrow.
