4.1 Tourism, Events and Promotions Committee Budget (Standing Item)

Acting Manager Community and Cultural Development advised that the total remaining budget for Tourism, Events and Promotions Committee for this financial year is \$17,263.21.

4.2 TEP New General Member

One application from Deanne Fenton was received, and this was endorsed by Council at the Ordinary meeting on 13 April 2021. Deanne is on leave at the moment and will be joining the Committee at the next meeting.

4.4 Bannerconda Locations and Costs

Acting Manager Community and Cultural Development reported that the cost of each bannerconda system is \$1,240.

There are 27 available poles on Barrett Drive. These poles require a contractor to put up the banners. The Council Depot quoted \$15,500 to remove the existing system and install the bannerconda system on these poles.

There are other options in the CBD to put up banners. There are 13 poles that would suit this option on Bath Street, 10 on Railway Terrace and a select few on Gregory Terrace and around the CBD.

Discussion ensued whether bannerconda system is worth installing on Barrett Drive, considering the cost and the number of times they are used by different organisations.
